

What are “REQUIREMENTS for Graduation” ?

Below is a list of Core course requirements from both the Georgia Futures website for high school graduation and the Georgia University System for Freshman college enrollment.

- **Students following a Vocational, Trades, Certification path** should refer to the high school graduation requirements, CTAE path, GED, or placement test at the Technical or Vocational School and HOPE grant requirements. Here is an *example* for West GA Tech:

- **Students wishing to follow a 4 year college path** should refer to the GA University System requirements, http://www.usg.edu/assets/student_affairs/documents/Staying_on_Course.pdf
- **What is HOPE?** - HOPE scholarship and HOPE grant monies help pay for the cost of education in Georgia. Some **Dual-enroll** classes at local colleges may count for college credit and/or “Rigor” requirements for HOPE scholarship purposes in addition to high school graduation requirements.

Many of the below courses are offered at Eagles Nest Eluminatus of Newnan.

Students may obtain courses in their home school program, at Eluminatus, with private tutors, at other programs, or through Dual enrollment (MOWR) at local colleges, even 4H or Scouts, to complete their high school education and graduation requirements.

What about Transcripts?

Accredited transcript – and diploma may be obtained for an additional fee on an accredited track. Please refer to the link on the ENCHEA website for information regarding Accredited Transcripts if you are interested in this option. It is not required, but you must be a member of Eagles Nest to use our service.

Non-Accredited transcript - Home school parents may create their own diploma and transcript on an independent, non-accredited track.
