Bridge is a home school support center that helps a homeschooling parent to educate their children. Our goal is to work along-side parents where additional help is desired in a loving and Christian environment. These courses are for students 4th grade through 8th grade where the Parent is the Teacher but would like support from a tutor in a particular subject. The Tutor sets the pace of the course and assignments. The Parent helps the student to work through the assignments at home each week. Students can expect to spend approximately one hour per day on homework during the week for each class. Grades are issued by the tutor; however, parents are ultimately responsible for their students grades and records per the Georgia Department of Education's Declaration of Intent to Homeschool.

CLASSES meet weekly on Thursdays, August 16, 2018 to May 9th, 2019, for Lecture and Lab. Students are to complete all work at home to be ready for class each week. EN and Tutors reserve the right to dismiss students for lack of attendance, non-completion of assignments, or conduct.

ENROLLMENT is open from April 1st to June 30th, \$40 fee per family, Late enrollment July 1st to July 15th, \$70 fee per family, Super Late enrollment July 16th to Aug. 1st, \$100 fee per family. **There will be absolutely no registrations after Aug. 1, 2018.** The course descriptions, tuition, and enrollment forms, are available online, but must be mailed with your non-refundable enrollment fee. Space is limited.

ORIENTATION and FINANCIAL COMMITMENT IS MANDATORY - ORIENTATION and FINANCIAL COMMITMENT IS MANDATORY - There are no exceptions, so please make arrangements to be at orientation. We want you to be fully informed as you sign your financial commitment. **All students and at least one parent is required to attend one of the Orientation meetings and sign the Statement of Cooperation.** This is the agreement to abide by the Information, Conduct (student handbook), and Church Policy, located on www.enchea.com under the Academics tab for Eluminatus. **Financial commitment forms are signed at Orientation.**

Materials and Lab Fees: are due July 15th paid directly to the tutor and are non-refundable

Tuition: The first tuition payment is due August 1st. If classes are dropped for low enrollment, your fees are refundable. If you drop classes after July 15th, you must still pay the Materials/Lab fees. Once classes begin, you are committed for one semester at a time. If you drop classes after August 1st, you still owe your first semester tuition in full. You must notify us by no later than November 10th if you wish to drop for 2nd semester or you still owe for the 2nd Semester tuition in full.

Parent Service Requirement: All parents are required to serve a few times a year on Parent Squad to support the program Directors. The goal of Parent Squad is to keep the students safe, to make sure they observe the behavior guidelines and the church policies. A Sign-Up Genius will be set up for you to choose the dates you want to serve. Parents are responsible for finding their own subs from among other registered families if unable to serve on their assigned day. **We take your student's safety seriously; failing to arrange for a sub or simply not showing up is considered a breach of the Statement of Cooperation and will result in a \$50 fine.**

PREPARATION FOR MIDDLE SCHOOL LANGUAGE ARTS

Course Description: Time: 1-hour class **Minimum students 4** **Open +/- 5th grade**

For our youngest students, this course will focus on improving the skills needed for academic Language Arts readiness for middle school. The class will provide practice in grammar, reading comprehension and composition. Students should expect to spend about 30 minutes each day on their assignments.

No Pre-Requisite: This class is open to all students preparing for middle school academics.

MS LEVEL 1: BEGINNING MIDDLE SCHOOL LANGUAGE ARTS

Course Description: Time: 1-hour class

Minimum students 5

Open 6-8th grade

This course will introduce the grammar and composition skills needed for academic success. In addition to practicing grammar concepts, the class will cover: outlines, topic sentences, paragraphs, transitions, varied sentence beginnings, note taking skills, and more. Students will explore descriptive, narrative, and expository writing with the purpose of creating solid paragraphs. Students should expect to spend about an hour each day on their assignments.

No Pre-Requisite: 6th-8th graders that need practice with grammar and paragraph structure.

MS LEVEL 2: PRACTICING MIDDLE SCHOOL LANGUAGE ARTS

Course Description: Time: 1-hour class

Minimum students 5

Open 6-8th grade

This course will continue to develop the grammar and composition skills needed for academic success through review and further practice. Students will learn to write descriptive, narrative, persuasive, and expository essays while also beginning to analyze literature. A strong focus of the composition instruction will be centered on creating a strong thesis which can then be supported throughout the essay. Students should expect to spend about an hour each day on their assignments.

Pre-Requisite: Students should already be comfortable with grammar skills and paragraph composition. It is suggested to take MS Level 1, or its equivalency, prior to this class.

MS LEVEL 3: PERFECTING MIDDLE SCHOOL LANGUAGE ARTS

Course Description: Time: 1-hour class

Minimum students 5

Open 7-8th grade

This course will focus on improving the reading, writing, thinking, and speaking skills needed for academic success. We will explore a variety of short stories, novels, non-fiction, and poetry. As we explore literature and learn literary terms, students will be engaged in developing their writing abilities through literature responses, various types of essays, and a research paper. Their grasp of writing conventions and grammatical usage will be reinforced, and they will be expected to demonstrate this in their writing. Students should expect to spend an hour each day on assignments.

No Pre-Requisite: 7th and 8th graders are encouraged to take this course as preparation for the more rigorous high school curriculum.

READING FOUNDATIONS (The 9:45 class is closed, the 11:15 class is available.)

Course Description: 1-hour class Minimum 3, Maximum 6 Open 4th-7th grades

This course is designed for the reader who is struggling with word attack skills, fluency, spelling and reading comprehension. The class will focus on building the foundation of phonetic skills using Spell to Write and Read. With this program, the class will learn phonograms, spelling rules, and have weekly spelling tests. The class will also learn the basic building blocks of our language by studying Greek and Latin roots. Additionally, students will practice organizing ideas to begin the writing process. Oral reading will be practiced in an encouraging fun environment.

No Pre-requisite

Course description: 1-hour class Minimum 4, Maximum 10 Open 4th-7th grades

This course is for reluctant readers and writers who need extra instruction, practice, time and encouragement to master language arts. We will work on solidifying grammar skills, introducing the world of literature, building vocabulary, and gaining confidence in written expression. The class will read poetry and short stories by such authors as Poe, Sandberg, Dickinson, Tolstoy, Twain and Kipling. They will also read The Magician's Nephew, The Sign of the Beaver, and From the Mixed-Up Files of Mrs. Basil E. Frankweiler. Students will write original poetry, short stories, essays and a research paper.

No Pre-Requisite

SAXON MATH 5/4

Instructor: Cathy Tohal

Course Description:

1.5 hours

Minimum 2 Maximum 15

4th – 5th grade

Saxon Math Homeschool 5/4 focuses on upper 4th grade and lower 5th grade algebraic reasoning and geometric concepts through a spiral approach. 5/4 textbook covers concepts such as whole number concepts and computation; arithmetic algorithms, geometry and measurement; elapsed time; fractions, decimals and percents; powers and roots; estimation; patterns and sequences; congruency and similarity; and statistic and probability. Students will specifically learn to add three-digit numbers, divide with two-digit answers, multiply three or more factors, simplify fraction answers use a decimal number line and more. Lessons contain a review, new lesson introduction, and practice. Hands on activities and visual charts will be used.

Course Description: 1 hour Minimum 2, Maximum 15 5th – 6th grade

Saxon Math Homeschool 6/5 focuses on upper 5th grade and lower 6th grade math concepts through a spiral approach. Math 6/5 covers the order of operations; geometry and measurement; integers; divisibility concepts; ratios; statistics and probability; prime and composite numbers; patterns and sequences; and powers and roots. Students will specifically learn about making a multiplication table, adding/subtracting fractions with a common denominator, multiplying by multiples of 10 and 100, perimeter, simple probability, decimal parts of a meter, reciprocals, volume, square roots, graphing points on a coordinate plane and more. Lessons contain a review, new lesson introduction, and practice. Hands on activities and visual charts will be used.

Saxon Math 7/6 is taught through a spiral approach and will help middle-school students gain a solid foundation of algebraic reasoning and geometric skills as they prepare to move on to higher-level math and algebraic equations. Saxon 7/6 textbook introduces functions and coordinate graphing, integers, exponential expressions, and prime factorization. Students will specifically learn about the order of operations, number lines, decimal place value, how to find the percent of a number, how to round decimal numbers, attributes of geometric solids and more. Lessons contain a review, new lesson introduction and practice. Hands on activities and visual charts will be used.

Course Description: 1.5 hour Minimum 2 Maximum 15 7th – 8th grade

Saxon 8/7 is taught through a spiral approach and will help middle-school students gain a solid foundation of algebraic reasoning and geometric skills as they prepare to move on to higher-level math and algebraic equations. This Saxon 8/7 textbook reviews arithmetic calculation, measurements, geometry and other skills, and introduces pre-algebra, ratios, probability and statistics. Students will specifically learn about adding/subtracting/multiplying fractions, equivalent fractions, the metric system, repeating decimals, scientific notation, Pi, graphing inequalities, multiplying algebraic terms, the Pythagorean Theorem, the slope-intercept form of linear equations and more. Lessons contain a review, new lesson introduction and practice. Hands on activities and visual charts will be used.

Course Description: 1.5 hours Minimum 5 Maximum 14 7th – 8th grade

The Saxon 1/2 text is the culmination of pre-algebra mathematics, a full pre-algebra course and an Introduction to geometry and discrete mathematics. Some topics covered include Prime and Composite numbers; fractions & decimals; order of operations, coordinates, exponents, square roots, ratios, algebraic phrases, probability, the Pythagorean Theorem and more. Utilizing an incremental approach to math, your students will learn in small doses at their own pace, increasing retention of knowledge and satisfaction. ***if your student is strong in math, they may take this course after 7/6, however if they struggle, I would suggest they take 8/7 first.** Students should expect to spend an hour each day on their assignments. Additional information: Parents are required to grade each week's lessons before the next class.

GENERAL SCIENCE 4th-6th (This class is closed.)
