Bridge is a home school support center that helps a homeschooling parent to educate their children. Our goal is to work along-side parents where additional help is desired in a loving and Christian environment. These courses are for students 4th grade through 8th grade where the Parent is the Teacher, but would like support from a tutor in a particular subject. The Tutor sets the pace of the course and assignments. The Parent helps the student to work through the assignments at home each week. Students can expect to spend approximately one hour per day on homework during the week for each class. Grades are issued by the tutor; however, parents are ultimately responsible for their student's grades and records per the Georgia Department of Education's Declaration of Intent to Homeschool.

CLASSES meet weekly on Thursdays, August 13, 2020 to May 13th, 2021, for Lecture and Lab. Students are to complete all work at home to be ready for class each week. **EN and Tutors reserve the right to dismiss students for lack of attendance, non-completion of assignments, or conduct.**

ENROLLMENT is open from March 1st to June 30th, \$50 fee per family, Late enrollment July 1st to July 15th, \$70 fee per family, Super Late enrollment July 16th to Aug. 1st, \$100 fee per family. **There will be absolutely no registrations after Aug. 1, 2020** The course descriptions, tuition, and enrollment forms are available online, but must be mailed with your non-refundable enrollment fee. Space is limited.

ORIENTATION and FINANCIAL COMMITMENT IS MANDATORY - ORIENTATION and FINANCIAL COMMITMENT IS MANDATORY - There are no exceptions, so please make arrangements to be at orientation. We want you to be fully informed as you sign your financial commitment. All students and at least one parent are required to attend one of the Orientation meetings and sign the Statement of Cooperation. This is the agreement to abide by the Information, Conduct (student handbook), Financial Agreement, and Church Policy, located on www.enchea.com under the Academics tab for Bridge. **Financial commitment forms are signed at Orientation.**

Materials and Lab Fees: are due July 15th paid directly to the tutor and are non-refundable. If you drop a class after July 15, YOU MUST STILL PAY THE MATERIALS FEE TO THE TUTOR!!!! Tutors will contact you via email with their address. If you are not contacted, do not worry! Just bring your fee with you to the first day of class.

Tuition: The first tuition payment is due August 1st. If classes are dropped for low enrollment, your fees will be refunded. If you drop classes after July 15th, you must still pay the Materials/Lab fees. Once classes begin, you are committed for one semester at a time. **If you drop classes after August 1st, you still owe your first semester tuition in full.** You must notify us by no later than November 10th if you wish to drop for 2nd semester or you still owe for the 2nd Semester tuition in full.

Parent Service Requirement: All parents are required to serve a few times a year on Parent Squad to support the program Directors. The goal of Parent Squad is to keep the students safe, and to make sure they observe the behavior guidelines and the church policies. A Sign-Up Genius will be set up for you to choose the dates you want to serve. Parents are responsible for finding their own subs from among other registered families if unable to serve on their assigned day. **We take your student's safety seriously; failing to arrange for a sub or simply not showing up is considered a breach of the Statement of Cooperation and will result in a \$50 fine.**

MS LEVEL 7/6 LANGUAGE ARTS

Instructor: Mrs. Jennifer Switzer

Course Description: **Time:** 1-hour class

Minimum students 5 Open 6-7th grade

Course description: This course will introduce the grammar and composition skills needed for academic success. In addition to practicing grammar concepts, the class will cover: outlines, topic sentences, paragraphs, transitions, varied sentence beginnings, note taking skills, and more. Students will explore descriptive, narrative, and expository writing with the purpose of creating solid paragraphs. Students should expect to spend about an hour each day on their assignments.

No Pre-Requisite: 6th-7th graders that need practice with grammar and paragraph structure.

MS LEVEL 8/7 LANGUAGE ARTS

Course Description: **Time:** 1-hour class **Minimum students** 5 **Open** 7-8th grade

This course will focus on improving the reading, writing, thinking, and speaking skills needed for academic success. We will explore a variety of short stories, novels, non-fiction, and poetry. As we explore literature and learn literary terms, students will be engaged in developing their writing abilities through literature responses, various types of essays, and a research paper. Their grasp of writing conventions and grammatical usage will be reinforced, and they will be expected to demonstrate this in their writing. Students should expect to spend an hour each day on assignments.

No Pre-Requisite: 7th and 8th graders are encouraged to take this course as final preparation for the more rigorous high school curriculum.

READING FOUNDATIONS

Instructor: Mrs. Michelle Bradfield

Course Description: **1.5-hour class** **Minimum 4, Maximum 10** **Open 4th-6th grades**

This course is designed for the reader who is struggling with word attack skills, fluency, spelling and reading comprehension. The class will focus on building the foundation of phonetic skills using *Spell to Write and Read* (materials provided by Mrs. Bradfield). With this program, the class will learn phonograms, spelling rules, and have weekly spelling tests. The class will also learn the basic building blocks of our language by studying Greek and Latin roots. Small weekly writing assignments will be assigned. Oral reading will be practiced in an encouraging fun environment.

Pre-requisite: Must be able to recognize and write the letters of the alphabet.

Course description: **1-hour class** **Minimum 4, Maximum 10** **Open 5th-7th grades**

This course is designed for reluctant readers and writers who need extra instruction, practice, time and encouragement to master language arts. We will work on solidifying grammar skills, exploring different genres of literature, and gaining confidence in written expression. The class will read poetry and short stories by such authors as Poe, Frost, Longfellow, and Irving. Also, they will learn the characteristics of folk tales, fables, myths, and legends. Students will also read *The Shakespeare Stealer*, *Number the Stars*, and *Island of the Blue Dolphins*. Students will do original creative writing, plus essay writing and a research paper.

No Pre-Requisite

AMERICAN HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHY

Course Description 1 hour, 15 min.

Minimum 4 Maximum 12

Open 4th-6th grade

In this course, middle schoolers will experience American History from creation to modern day. Through a variety of media including textbooks, living books, biographies, videos, hands-on activities, and at-home projects, students will learn how the earliest inhabitants made it to this land, about the explorers, the colonies, the Revolutionary War, the building of the nation, the Civil War, Reconstruction, the World Wars, all the way to modern times. It is my goal to help students understand the present and prepare for the future by studying the past. U.S. and Canada Geography will be incorporated into this course.

WORLD HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHY

Course Description: 1 hour, 15 min.

Minimum 4 Maximum 12

Open 6th-8th grade

In this course, students will travel through time from Creation to the early 21st century. Throughout it all, they will see the hand of God and observe history as HIS-story, understanding events as they relate to God's plan for mankind. Units of study include The Beginning (Creation, Fall, Flood, Dispersion), Egypt, Israel, Assyria, Babylon, Persia, Greece, Rome, The Early Church, Islam v. Christendom, From Empire to Feudalism, An Age of Darkness, The Protestant Reformation, The Age of Exploration, The United States, Science and Industry in the Modern Age, New World Classics, World War I and the rise of Communism, World War II, The Cold War Era, and the New Millennium. We will use a variety of hands-on, multi-sensory activities, read maps and practice cartography. It is my goal to help students understand the present and prepare for the future by studying the past. World Geography will be incorporated into this course.

SAXON MATH 6/5

Instructor: Mrs. Cathy Tohal

Course Description: 1 hour, 15 min. Minimum 4, Maximum 15 5th – 6th grade

Saxon Math Homeschool 6/5 focuses on upper 5th grade and lower 6th grade math concepts through a spiral approach. Math 6/5 covers the order of operations; geometry and measurement; integers; divisibility concepts; ratios; statistics and probability; prime and composite numbers; patterns and sequences; and powers and roots. Students will specifically learn about making a multiplication table, adding/subtracting fractions with a common denominator, multiplying by multiples of 10 and 100, perimeter, simple probability, decimal parts of a meter, reciprocals, volume, square roots, graphing points on a coordinate plane and more. Lessons contain a review, new lesson introduction, and practice. Hands on activities and visual charts will be used. ****Please note that parents are required to grade homework daily.**

Course Description: 1 hour, 25 min. Minimum 5 Maximum 15 6th – 7th grade

Saxon Math 7/6 is taught through a spiral approach and will help middle-school students gain a solid foundation of algebraic reasoning and geometric skills as they prepare to move on to higher-level math and algebraic equations. Saxon 7/6 textbook introduces functions and coordinate graphing, integers, exponential expressions, and prime factorization. Students will specifically learn about the order of operations, number lines, decimal place value, how to find the percent of a number, how to round decimal numbers, attributes of geometric solids and more. Lessons contain a review, new lesson introduction and practice. Hands on activities and visual charts will be used. ****Please note that parents are required to grade homework daily.**

Course Description: 1.5 hours Minimum 5 Maximum 15 7th – 8th grade

The Saxon ½ text is the culmination of pre-algebra mathematics, a full pre-algebra course and an Introduction to geometry and discrete mathematics. Some topics covered include Prime and Composite numbers; fractions & decimals; order of operations, coordinates, exponents, square roots, ratios, algebraic phrases, probability, the Pythagorean Theorem and more. Utilizing an incremental approach to math, your students will learn in small doses at their own pace, increasing retention of knowledge and satisfaction. ***If your student is strong in math, they may take this course after 7/6, however if they struggle, I would suggest they take 8/7 first.** Students should expect to spend an hour each day on their assignments. Additional information: Parents are required to grade each week's lessons before the next class.

In this course, we will continue using our book series in *Answers in Genesis*. We will be looking closely at the atomic world! As in my other courses, I use the text as a great source to jump off and add much more additional information. This course is a must before high school as we will cover all of the basic concepts and vocabulary that are used in later chemistry courses. We do lots of hands-on experiments, dome mini-reports and will keep a notebook on the Elements, along with other information.

ART

CREATIVE ARTISTS: 4th-8th grade - PRINCIPLES OF DRAWING, PAINTING AND CLAY

Instructor: April Parker

Course Description: 1hr 30min. Minimum Students: 5 Max 17

Creative Artists is a fun way to learn foundational art principles and concepts. I believe drawing is something everyone can learn just like everyone can learn to play an instrument. Learning to draw is the foundation of everything we will be doing. However, drawing can take many different forms. This class is called “Creative Artists” because I try to allow students “creative” ways to display their learning process. Students will complete at least one (often 2) project a month. Within these projects, students will learn foundational drawing techniques, painting skills, introduction to watercolor and get to create an amazing pottery project. Over the course of a school year we will work on 5-6 painting projects using mostly acrylics on canvas. One project will be on an 8 x 10 wooden block. Last year it was our Fall Pumpkin Painting Paintings and they turned out amazing. Students were able to design not just the front but the sides of the wood; plus, the art stands on it on. I often let my class vote on their pottery theme but in the past some themes have been turtles, owls, pandas, vases. I do have my own kiln so we learn about the hand building process of creating clay, the process of “firing clay” and the steps of glazing pottery to become truly glass art. This class allows students to work at their own learning pace. So, whether new to the process of creating art or quite experienced..... And because all projects are created on quality surfaces like canvas, wood, pottery... My goal is that this class will be a lesson that will last a lifetime.
