Course Descriptions 2021-2022

Bridge is a homeschool support center assisting homeschooling parents to educate their children. Our goal is to work alongside parents where additional help is desired in a caring Christian environment.

Bridge courses are for students in grades 4 through 8. **The parent is the teacher**, with Bridge tutors providing support. The tutor sets the pace of the course and assignments. **The parent helps the student work through daily assignments at home.**

Students can expect to spend approximately one hour per day on homework during the week for each class. Grades are issued by the tutor; however, **parents are ultimately responsible for their student's grades and records per the Georgia Department of Education's Declaration of Intent to Homeschool.**

Please read the following information before registering to be sure that Bridge is a good fit for your family.

Classes

Classes meet weekly on Thursdays from August 12, 2021 to May 12, 2022, for lecture and lab. Students are to complete all work at home to be ready for class each week. **Eagle's Nest, Bridge, and tutors reserve the right to dismiss students for lack of attendance, non-completion of assignments, or unacceptable conduct.**

Enrollment

Enrollment is open from March 1st to July 15th, 2021.

- Early Enrollment: March 1st to June 30th -- \$60 fee per family
- Late Enrollment: July 1st to July 15th -- \$75 fee per family

There will be no registrations accepted after July 15, 2021. The course descriptions, tuition, and enrollment forms are available online. The enrollment form must be mailed with your non-refundable enrollment fee. Space is limited.

Orientation and Financial Commitment

Orientation is mandatory! There are no exceptions, so please make arrangements to be at orientation. **All students and at least one parent are required to attend an orientation meeting and sign the Statement of Cooperation.** This is the agreement to abide by the Information, Conduct (student handbook), and Church Policy, located on www.enchea.com under the Academics tab for Bridge.

Financial commitment forms are signed at Orientation. We want you to be fully informed as you sign your financial commitment.

Tuition

The first tuition payment is due August 1st. If classes are dropped due to low enrollment, your fees will be refunded. If you drop classes after July 15th, you must still pay the Materials/Lab fees. Once classes begin, you are committed for one semester at a time. **If you drop classes after August 1st, you are still required to pay the first semester's tuition in full. You must notify us by no later than November 10th if you wish to drop for second semester or you still owe for the second semester tuition in full.**

Materials/Lab Fees

Fees for materials and labs are due July 15th. These non-refundable fees are paid directly to the tutors so they can obtain the materials needed for their classes. **If you drop a class after July 15th, you must still pay the materials/lab fees in full!** Tutors will contact you via email with their address. If you are not contacted, do not worry! Just bring your fee with you to the first day of class.

Parent Service Requirement

All parents are required to serve a few times a year on Parent Squad to support the program directors. The goal of Parent Squad is to keep the students safe and make sure they observe the behavior guidelines and church policies. A signupgenius.com list will be set up for you to choose the dates you want to serve. Parents are responsible for finding their own subs from among other registered families if unable to serve on their assigned day. **We take our students' safety seriously; failing to arrange for a sub or simply not showing up is considered a breach of the Statement of Cooperation and will result in a \$50 fine.**

MS Language Arts	
Instructor: Mrs. Jennifer Switzer	Class time: 1-hour class
Grades: 7-8	Minimum 5 students
Course Description: This course will continue to develop the grammar and composition skills needed for academic success through review and further practice. Students will learn to write descriptive, narrative, persuasive, and expository essays while also beginning to analyze literature. A strong focus of the composition instruction will be centered on creating a strong thesis which can then be supported throughout the essay. Students should expect to spend about an hour each day on their assignments.	
Prerequisites: Students should already be comfortable with grammar skills and paragraph composition. It is suggested to take at least one year of a previous middle school course prior to this class.

Grades: 4-6	Minimum 4 max 10 students
Course Description: This course is designed for the reader who is struggling with word attack skills, fluency, spelling and reading comprehension. The class will focus on building the foundation of phonetic skills using <i>Spell to Write and Read</i> (materials provided by Mrs. Bradfield). With this program, the class will learn phonograms, spelling rules, and have weekly spelling tests. The class will also learn the basic building blocks of our language by studying Greek and Latin roots. Small weekly writing assignments will be assigned. Oral reading will be practiced in an encouraging fun environment.

Grades: 5-6	Minimum 4 max 10 students	
Course Description: This course is designed for reluctant readers and writers who need extra instruction, practice, time, and encouragement to master language arts. We will work on solidifying grammar skills, introducing the world of literature, building vocabulary, and gaining confidence in written expression. The class will read poetry and short stories by such authors as Poe, Sandberg, Dickinson, Tolstoy, Twain and Kipling. They will also read <i>The Magician's Nephew</i> , <i>The Sign of the Beaver</i> , and <i>From the Mixed-Up Files of Mrs. Basil E. Frankweiler</i> . Students will write original poetry, short stories, essays, and a research paper.

Grades: 4-6	Minimum 4 max 12 students	
Course Description: In this course, middle schoolers will experience American History from creation to modern day. Through a variety of media including textbooks, living books, biographies, videos, hands-on activities, and at-home projects, students will learn how the earliest inhabitants made it to this land, about the explorers, the colonies, the Revolutionary War, the building of the nation, the Civil War, Reconstruction, the World Wars, all the way to modern times. It is my goal to help students understand the present and prepare for the future by studying the past. U.S. and Canada Geography will be incorporated into this course.

Grades: 6-8	Minimum 4 max 12 students	
<p>Course Description: In this course, students will travel through time from Creation to the early 21st century. Throughout it all, they will see the hand of God and observe history as HIS-story, understanding events as they relate to God's plan for mankind. Units of study include The Beginning (Creation, Fall, Flood, Dispersion), Egypt, Israel, Assyria, Babylon, Persia, Greece, Rome, The Early Church, Islam v. Christendom, From Empire to Feudalism, An Age of Darkness, The Protestant Reformation, The Age of Exploration, The United States, Science and Industry in the Modern Age, New World Classics, World War I and the rise of Communism, World War II, The Cold War Era, and the New Millennium. We will use a variety of hands-on, multi-sensory activities, read, and draw maps. It is my goal to help students understand the present and prepare for the future by studying the past. World Geography will be incorporated into this course.</p>

Grades: 6-7	Minimum 4 max 15 students	
<p>Course Description: Saxon Math 7/6 is taught through a spiral approach and will help middle-school students gain a solid foundation of algebraic reasoning and geometric skills as they prepare to move on to higher-level math and algebraic equations. Saxon 7/6 textbook introduces functions and coordinate graphing, integers, exponential expressions, and prime factorization. Students will specifically learn about the order of operations, number lines, decimal place value, how to find the percent of a number, how to round decimal numbers, attributes of geometric solids and more. Lessons contain a review, new lesson introduction, and practice. Grades: 7-8	Minimum 4 max 15 students	
<p>Course Description: Saxon Math 8/7 is taught through a spiral approach and will help middle-school students gain a solid foundation of algebraic reasoning and geometric skills as they prepare to move on to higher-level math and algebraic equations. The Saxon 8/7 textbook reviews arithmetic calculation, measurements, geometry, and other skills, and introduces pre-algebra, rations, probability, and statistics. Students will specifically learn about adding/subtracting/multiplying fractions, equivalent fractions, the metric system, repeating decimals, scientific notation, Pi, graphing inequalities, multiplying algebraic terms, the Pythagorean Theorem, the slope-intercept form of linear equations, and more. Lessons contain a review, new lesson introduction, and practice. <p>Course Description: The Saxon ½ text is the culmination of pre-algebra mathematics, a full pre-algebra course and an introduction to geometry and discrete mathematics. Some topics covered include Prime and Composite numbers; fractions & decimals; order of operations, coordinates, exponents, square roots, ratios, algebraic phrases, probability, the Pythagorean Theorem and more. Utilizing an incremental approach to math, your students will learn in small doses at their own pace, increasing retention of knowledge and satisfaction. *If your student is strong in math, they may take this course after 7/6, however if they struggle, I suggest they take 8/7 first. Students should expect to spend an hour each day on their assignments.</p>
